Northamptonshire County Golf Club, a welcoming and progressive Club with considerable reputation and history, fully understands the need to maintain the finest traditions whilst recognising modern standards. To this end, we respectfully ask that everyone, whether member, guest or visitor, adheres to the dress code set out below.

## **Dress Code 2015/16**

### **On The Course and Practice Areas – Men and Junior Boys**

Appropriate golf clothing and footwear should be worn at all times. Trainers are not acceptable. No blue denim clothing or faded jeans, no cut-offs, track suits or cargo pants. Shorts, if worn, should be tailored and not finish below the knee and must be accompanied by knee length socks. Cargo and other forms of shorts are not acceptable. Trousers may not be tucked into socks unless overtrousers are worn. Shirts should be tucked into trousers and shorts. It is not acceptable to wear rugby or football shirts nor shirts with names (excluding logos) or numbers on them.

Golf shoes are not to be worn in the Clubhouse apart from the designated areas such as the main entrance lobby and the Locker Room.

### **On The Course and Practice Areas – Ladies and Junior Girls**

The above is relevant to ladies and junior girls except that ladies' golf shirts should cover the collarbone and tops designed not to be tucked in at the waist may be worn but no bare midriffs to be visible and the bottom of the shirt/top should finish below the top of the trousers/shorts or skirt. Ladies' cut-offs, shorts and skirts can be accompanied by short/bikini socks.

### **Colt Course and Putting Green Immediately outside the Clubhouse**

The same standard of attire is expected on the Colt Course but for juniors and adults, who are just starting to play the game, a degree of flexibility will be shown when it comes to footwear and smart trainers will be acceptable footwear on the Colt course.

Footwear that is not damaging to the putting green immediately outside the clubhouse may be worn on this area when practising putting.

### **In the Clubhouse – All Members, Guests and Visitors**

All members, guests and visitors are expected to wear clean clothing and are encouraged to change from the clothing worn to play. Smart casual clothing is acceptable in all areas and at all times, unless a specific dress code is stipulated. Male shirts must be tucked in at the waist and no form of headgear is to be worn.

Blue denim clothing, faded jeans, any unclean or torn clothing either by fashion, accident or design and any form of sports clothing other than appropriate golfing attire are not acceptable in any part of the Clubhouse. Windproof and wet weather outer golf clothing should be removed prior to entering the bars, veranda and dining room and left in the locker rooms.

Clean footwear must be worn at all times in the clubhouse and gentlemen who wish to wear sandals are required to wear these with socks. Trainers and flip-flops are not acceptable forms of footwear.

### **Breach of Code**

Where members, guests or visitors are found to be in breach of the dress code they will be politely asked to change into something that is appropriate. Where they are unable so to do they may be asked to leave the clubhouse or course.

### **Other Matters**

When the clubhouse is open members, guests and visitors must change footwear and clothing in the designated locker rooms and not in the car park.

Mobile phones may be taken on to the course and practice areas but must be switched off or in silent mode. They may only be used on the course in an emergency.

In the clubhouse a mobile phone must only be used as a diary and at all times where switched on, must be in silent mode. Anyone wishing to use a mobile phone may do so only in the car park.
