



Northamptonshire County Golf Club respectfully ask that everyone, whether member, guest or visitor, adheres to the dress code set out below.

Dress Code 2017/18

On The Course and Practice Areas

Recognised golf clothing and footwear (trainers are not acceptable) should be worn at all times. When the clubhouse is open members, guests and visitors are encouraged to change in the designated locker rooms.

Men and Junior Boys

Shirts

Shirts should be tucked into trousers and shorts. It is not acceptable to wear rugby, football or T shirts nor shirts with names (excluding logos) or numbers on them.

Trousers

Trousers should be tailored. Blue denim clothing, faded or ripped jeans, cut-offs, track suits and cargo pants are not acceptable. Trousers may not be tucked into socks unless overtrousers or waterproofs are worn.

Shorts

Tailored golf shorts can be worn with, knee length socks of one colour or short plain white sports socks which must cover the ankle are the only permitted socks on the course when wearing shorts. Cargo and other forms of shorts are not acceptable.

Footwear

Recognised golfing footwear should be worn. Golf shoes are not to be worn in the Clubhouse apart from the designated areas such as the spikes bar, the main entrance lobby and the locker room.

Ladies and Junior Girls

As per the men and junior boys with the following exceptions:

Shirts

Ladies' golf shirts should cover the collarbone and tops designed not to be tucked in at the waist may be worn but no bare midriffs to be visible and the bottom of the shirt/top should finish below the top of the trousers/shorts or skirt.

Trousers/Shorts/Skirts

Ladies are allowed to wear cut-offs, shorts and skirts and these can be accompanied by short socks or bikini socks. Where Ladies choose to wear shorts or skirts these should be tailored and finish no higher than mid thigh.

Colt Course and Putting Green Immediately outside the Clubhouse

The same standard of attire is expected on the Colt Course but for juniors and adults, who are just starting to play the game, a degree of flexibility will be shown when it comes to footwear and smart trainers will be acceptable footwear on the Colt course.

Footwear that is not damaging to the putting green immediately outside the clubhouse may be worn on this area when practising putting.

In the Clubhouse – All Members, Guests and Visitors

What is deemed unacceptable clothing on the course applies to all areas of the clubhouse.

All members, guests and visitors are expected to wear clean clothing. Players coming in from the course when wet are asked to change before entering the bars, veranda and dining room. Overtrousers and any form of headgear are not acceptable.

Smart casual clothing is acceptable in all areas and at all times, unless a specific dress code is stipulated. Blue denim clothing, faded jeans, any unclean or torn clothing either by fashion, accident or design and any form of sports clothing other than recognised golfing attire are not acceptable in any part of the Clubhouse.

Clean footwear must be worn at all times in the clubhouse and gentlemen who wish to wear sandals are required to wear these with socks. Socks must accompany all forms of footwear worn by gentleman in the Clubhouse. Flip-flops are not acceptable forms of footwear and trainers are not permitted in the Clubhouse.
